Key Responsibilities:

- Assess current organizational fundraising activities and develop an annual fundraising plan in consultation with the Senior Leadership Team that identifies new funding opportunities from varied sources, including individual giving, corporate sponsorship, events, and grants
- Execute fundraising campaigns working alongside our marketing and communications team and track/report the effectiveness and results
- Work with the Executive Director to manage Board and Advisory Committees engagement in fundraising activities
- Oversee and execute the Centre's fundraising events including the Mindfulness Challenge, a peer-to-peer based meditate-athon including managing budgets, producers, and resources
- Identify key grant opportunities with our Community Program team and assist with grant writing
- Create compelling case statements, proposals, sponsorship decks, and stewardship materials
- Conduct all prospect/donor research to help identify new revenue sources included but not limited to Foundations, Corporations, and Major Gift prospects

Qualifications/Skills:

- A University Degree or College Diploma in related field
- A minimum of three years experience working in fundraising in the not-for-profit sector ideally working towards or obtained CFRE designation
- Experience using CanadaHelps Donor Management System, Grant Management Systems, and other peer-to-peer fundraising software
